The following schools will be participating in Provision 2 and provide breakfast meals at no charge to students: Chattanooga Valley Elementary, Chattanooga Valley Middle, Cherokee Ridge Elementary, Fairlyland Elementary, Gilbert Elementary, LaFayette High School, LaFayette Middle, Naomi Elementary, North LaFayette Elementary, Ridgeland High School, Rock Spring Elementary, Rossville Elementary, Rossville Middle, Saddle Ridge Elementary Middle and Stone Creek Elementary.

Provision 2 will not be implemented at Lunch. Meal prices will be determined by student eligibility.
